Rationale

The Early Years Pupil Premium Grant is a Government initiative that targets extra money at pupils from deprived backgrounds. Research shows that pupils from deprived backgrounds underachieve compared to their non-deprived peers. The premium is provided in order to support these pupils in reaching their potential.

In order to meet the above requirements, Langley Moor Nursery School will ensure that provision is made which secures the teaching and learning opportunities that meet the needs of all pupils. As part of the additional provision made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups we will ensure that the needs of the socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed through termly pupil progress meetings and data analysis.

Decisions around spending of EYPP were based on initial assessments of EYPP children, analysis of successful programmes used in previous years, a consultation document given to and received from parents, and research from the Education Endowment Foundation.

Nature of Support 2016/17

- Targeted support across Nursery linked to PSED, CLL and PD
- Focus on social, emotional and behaviour – targeted support, use of specialist resources
- Purchase 2 days from Speech Therapist to give advice for targeted support
- Staff training on “Blast Programme” a programme to develop speech and conversation skills
- Implementation of motor skill programme to be implemented with targeted children by external provider.
